#### **Access to Healthy Foods**

Community leaders and organizers created **2** community gardens in Jasper County: Jasper County Neighbors United and Ridgeland-Hardeeville High School.



### **Smoke-Free Communities9**

Jasper County School District adopted a district-wide smoke-free and tobacco-free policy. This policy effects all employees and visitors at **100%** of its schools: **2** elementary schools, **1** middle school, and **1** high school.
